

## ANNA MAJCHERCZYK

### Short bio:

Anna Majcherczyk (born 1981), violinist, graduated from the Academy of Music in Kraków and KUG in Graz. She played, among others at Bremer Philharmoniker, Suedwestdeutsche Philharmonie Konstanz, Hamburger Philharmoniker. She has performed in Europe, Asia and South America. Co-creator of "Basy i Bobasy" classical music family concert series in Krakow and Warsaw. Producer and author. Co-founder of the "Hello Classic "Foundation, which aims to promote high culture and support artists.

### Long bio:

Born in Krakow (Poland), the violinist Anna Majcherczyk graduated with honors from the Music Academy in Krakow and the University of Music and Performing Arts in Graz. Within the framework of “Socrates-Erasmus” Scholarship, she studied at the Universität Mozarteum in Salzburg. As concertmaster of the Krakow Youth Philharmonic Orchestra, she made her debut as a soloist with this orchestra at the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam. As a member of various ensembles she has performed in prestigious concert halls such as the Musikvereinsaal in Vienna, the Berliner Philharmonie and Tonhalle Zürich. She participated in master classes given by Thomas Brandis, Krzysztof Penderecki, Ralf Gothoni, Reiner Schmidt (Hagen Quartet) and Peter Goetzl and Volkhard Steude (Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra). From 2012 to 2018 she was associate leader of the second violins of the Bremen Philharmonic Orchestra. In 2016, during a sabbatical year, she taught violin at the National Institute of Music in San José, Costa Rica and other music schools in this country. She has dedicated herself to the promotion of classical music by creating, in her home country Poland, a series of concerts directed to family audiences. In 2020 she collaborated with the Fundación Sinfonía Concertante de Panama (FUNSINCOPA) teaching violin classes and being the liaison between FUNSINCOPA and the prestigious Orchestra of the Americas. She also created for this Foundation the successful international masterclass series “Escuela sin Fronteras”.
